Year 2 (2025-2026) Focus:

- Host leadership "Meet & Greet" events, making our leaders more relationally accessible and showing that leadership at Riverstone is rooted in service and care.
- Deepen our small group ministry with more life-stage and topical groups, helping people experience Christian community marked by sincere love.

Riverstone will be a visible expression of God's love in our local, regional, and global communities. Through consistent presence, genuine partnerships, and acts of service, we will model the love of Christ, showing that the gospel is good news for our neighbors too.

Year 2 (2025-2026) Focus:

- Participate consistently in town fairs, festivals, and public gatherings, becoming a trusted, loving presence in community life.
- Launch community-focused small groups that meet real needs, such as youth mentorship and food drives—direct expressions of the love we profess.
- Deepen strategic partnerships with local schools, businesses, and organizations to serve collaboratively in ways that reflect Christ's heart for the world.

Developing Ambassadors

The first three priorities find their fulfillment in this! Riverstone will equip every believer to embody the gospel with authenticity and compassion. In a world skeptical of Christianity, we will raise up ambassadors who don't just speak about Jesus but live like Him—known by their love for God and neighbor in everyday relationships and opportunities.

Year 2 (2025-2026) Focus:

- Launch new small groups that combine biblical learning with community service and mentorship, forming disciples who love in action, not just in word.
- Launch an internship program aimed at developing young people in the skills of ministry that will yield lifelong ministry impact.
- Offer quarterly ministry workshops to equip people in practical skills—like conflict resolution and community outreach—that demonstrate Christ's love in a broken world.
- Keep sharpening our preaching and discipleship ministries to center on sending people out in love, trained to meet real-world needs with grace.

May we be known by our love, but may our neighbors be overwhelmed by His!

One of the most visible changes we've embraced this year is our new name. What was once Avon Wesleyan Church is now Riverstone Wesleyan Church. This change was prayerfully and intentionally made to reflect the kind of church we are becoming. The name "Riverstone" symbolizes who we are—a people by the Living Water of Christ, grounded in truth, and rooted in love. It captures both the movement of the Spirit in our midst and the stability of our gospel foundation. We've noticed a clearer connection with new visitors and a fresh sense of identity as we engage with our community. Thank you for your support in this effort!

We've also taken important steps to improve and steward our physical space. From signage updates to improved hospitality areas and technology enhancements in our sanctuary, every upgrade was made with our mission in mind. These changes aren't just aesthetic—they reflect our commitment to creating a warm and welcoming environment where people can encounter Jesus, grow in their faith, and be sent to proclaim His life-giving love to everyone we know. We're continuing to think about how our space can better serve our mission and the needs of those around us.

Beyond our physical space, one of the main goals for this year was to hone our online presence. Thanks to the work of Christine Nichols, we have seen explosive growth in our social media and online presence. We will continue building on this momentum as we head into the 25-26 church year.

Refinement

This year, we also refined and recommitted to our long-term vision: Riverstone 2030: Known By Our Love. This plan serves as our north star, guiding us as we grow into a church that is marked by maximizing our resources, strengthening connections with all people, serving our communities, and developing ambassadors of Jesus Christ. We've begun aligning our ministries and leadership structures around this vision, and the early fruit has been encouraging. Reaching Out

As we look to the future, we're excited to deepen our discipleship and outreach efforts. Pastor Dan Blowers and Jaime Willistein will be leading us in developing clearer, more intentional pathways for spiritual formation—so that no one at Riverstone is unsure of how to take their next step with Jesus. Whether someone is just beginning their faith journey or has followed Christ for decades, we want everyone to grow, serve, and multiply their faith in others.

We also look forward to piloting a new internship program designed to equip emerging leaders for ministry in the church and beyond. Our hope is to become a place where young people sense a calling, receive training, and are launched into lifelong service. It starts with young folks catching a vision and participating in God's work.

This has been an exciting year filled with growth and change! Our Children's Ministry has welcomed new families, and we're seeing steady growth as more children join us. This past fall, we transitioned our midweek programming to Friday nights; however, we discovered that returning to Wednesday evenings worked better for more families.

We also refreshed our large main room, painting it to reflect our new Riverstone theme. Over the summer, we plan to update and decorate the remaining rooms to carry the theme throughout our space. In addition, we converted the old baptismal—which had become a health hazard due to groundwater leakage—into a ball pit for the kids.

Jake Farrell and Susan Crist have faithfully continued their year-long commitments to serving in the ministry. We also appointed Jaime Willistein as our new Teen and Young Adult Leader. I have been developing lesson plans that align with Pastor Ben's sermon series, and Jaime has been creating complementary lessons for the teen and young adult ministries.

Our Equip classes on Sunday mornings have been well attended, and we're preparing additional teachers to join us next year. I've outlined a nine-month Discipleship Journey schedule, with plans to offer classes during both morning services.

Small groups have taken on a new, organic feel this year. Several groups have started naturally, providing opportunities for people to connect personally, grow spiritually, and support one another through different life stages and circumstances. These include a Divorce Care group, a Prayer group, and a Discipleship-focused group, as well as groups for Young Adults, Young Women, and a Wednesday night sermon discussion group. We are actively strategizing how to expand and support even more groups in the coming year.

Our church events were again a blessing this year. Although attendance was slightly down at both the Live Nativity and Hop Into Spring events—largely due to poor weather—Trunk or Treat continues to be a strong outreach, providing a safe, fun environment for children in our community. Pastor Ben has also initiated plans for a new late-summer event aimed at supporting local families with school supplies.

I would like to personally thank all who have supported these ministries—our teachers, small group leaders, event volunteers, and nursery workers. I also want to thank those who pray faithfully for our church family. Your prayers have been powerful and deeply appreciated.

Rooted by the River *A Journey of Discipleship*

"They are like trees planted along the riverbank, bearing fruit in each season. Their leaves never wither and they prosper in all they do." -Psalm 1:3

Rooted by the River: A Journey of Discipleship is an 8-month discipleship plan developed for Riverstone Church to guide individuals on a steady path of spiritual growth, formation, and purpose. Inspired by Psalm 1:3, this journey invites participants to become like trees planted by the water—deeply rooted, fruitful, and spiritually resilient.

The plan consists of weekly lessons, grouped into different themes that explore foundational Christian truths, develop spiritual disciplines, clarify identity in Christ, and equip believers to live out their faith within the church and in the world. Each week focuses on a key biblical topic and Scripture, with discussion questions and personal application to help participants grow in both knowledge and practice.

Each weekly lesson includes open-ended discussion questions to prompt reflection and action. These questions ask participants to consider how Scripture applies to their lives and challenge them to live out their faith.

In total, this journey is designed to cultivate biblical understanding, encourage lasting transformation, and equip believers to be disciple-makers themselves. Rooted by the River reflects Riverstone Church's commitment to growing strong, Spirit-led followers of Christ who flourish in every season of life.

Youth and Young Adult Ministry

"What shall I do then with Jesus who is called the Christ?" (Matthew 27:22) This is the most important question that has ever been asked. It is also the question you must ask yourself." -Billy Graham

A New Perspective

In August 2024, I stepped into the role of Youth and Young Adult Coordinator after spending the previous year volunteering. As a mom and homeschool teacher/tutor for over 15 years, I've spent countless hours in deep conversations with kids about life, faith, and culture. And if there's one thing I've learned, it's this: if we want young people who've grown up in the church to truly own their faith, we need to challenge them to think.

This year, that's exactly what we've set out to do.

We've gone back to the basics—asking big, often difficult questions and creating space for honest conversations. In the fall, we took a retreat to Camp Hickory Hill, where I encouraged students to wrestle with Scripture, lean into their doubts, and engage deeply with what they believe. In today's culture, where even the most fundamental truths are being questioned, it's more important than ever to help students explore what's real—and to walk alongside them humbly as they search for answers.

Throughout the year in Sunday School, we journeyed through the Old Testament, tracing the story from the fall of man all the way to the birth, death, and resurrection of Jesus. The questions these students asked were thoughtful—and sometimes tough enough to send me home for some serious research before I could respond well!

But the results have been powerful. We're building a culture where students feel safe to ask hard questions, where they're forming strong connections with each other, and—most importantly—where they're turning to God's Word for truth. Their faith is becoming personal, rooted, and real.



Young Adult



We're excited to celebrate the launch of our Young Adult Ministry, which has taken off thanks to the leadership and passion of Malachi Crist and Jaidyn Mattison. By empowering them to lead small groups, we've seen incredible growth—not just in numbers, but in connection and community. This group has become a place where young adults are building each other up, diving deeper into their faith, and showing what it means to support one another through life's ups and downs. It's been amazing to watch this ministry come to life!

In the coming year, expect to see more growth in our programs, an increased commitment to developing our Young Adults, and a focus on outreach and service.
